**HEAD OF SCHOOL WELCOME LETTER**

One of the enduring strengths of Highland Christian School is the diversity of the community we share. Our students and families represent a wide range of backgrounds, experiences, and perspectives, yet we are united by a common commitment to faith, learning, and the formation of Christ-centered character. This diversity is not merely a feature of our school — it is one of the ways God enriches and strengthens our community.

Scripture reminds us that God’s design for community has always included difference: “For just as each of us has one body with many members.. so in Christ we, though many, form one body” (Romans 12:4–5). Christian education embraces this truth by recognizing that each child is uniquely created, carrying distinct gifts and ways of engaging the world. At Highland Christian, these differences deepen learning and cultivate empathy, humility, and mutual respect.

Malcolm Gladwell, in *David and Goliath* (a great read), challenges common assumptions about strength when he writes, “The powerful and the strong are not always what they seem,” and observing, “We consistently get things wrong when we make assumptions about who has the advantage.” Though expressed in a different context, this perspective echoes a biblical pattern: God often works through unexpected people and circumstances, revealing hidden strengths and possibilities.

Within a Christian school community, our diversity becomes an opportunity rather than an obstacle. Students learn not only academic content but also how to value others as image-bearers of God, growing through daily interactions with classmates whose experiences may differ from their own.

As we reflect on the life of Highland Christian School, we give thanks for the many individuals and families who shape its character. Our strength lies not in uniformity, but in the shared pursuit of truth and grace across our differences — a living expression of the body of Christ.

With this truth comes an invitation. Each of us has been entrusted with gifts that can bless and strengthen our community. Whether through service, encouragement, leadership, generosity, creativity, or prayer, we all have a role in advancing the mission of Christian education at Highland Christian. Through your gifts and stewardship, we are able to lean into our vision to academically equip, Biblically ground, and spiritually nurture to impact the world for Christ.

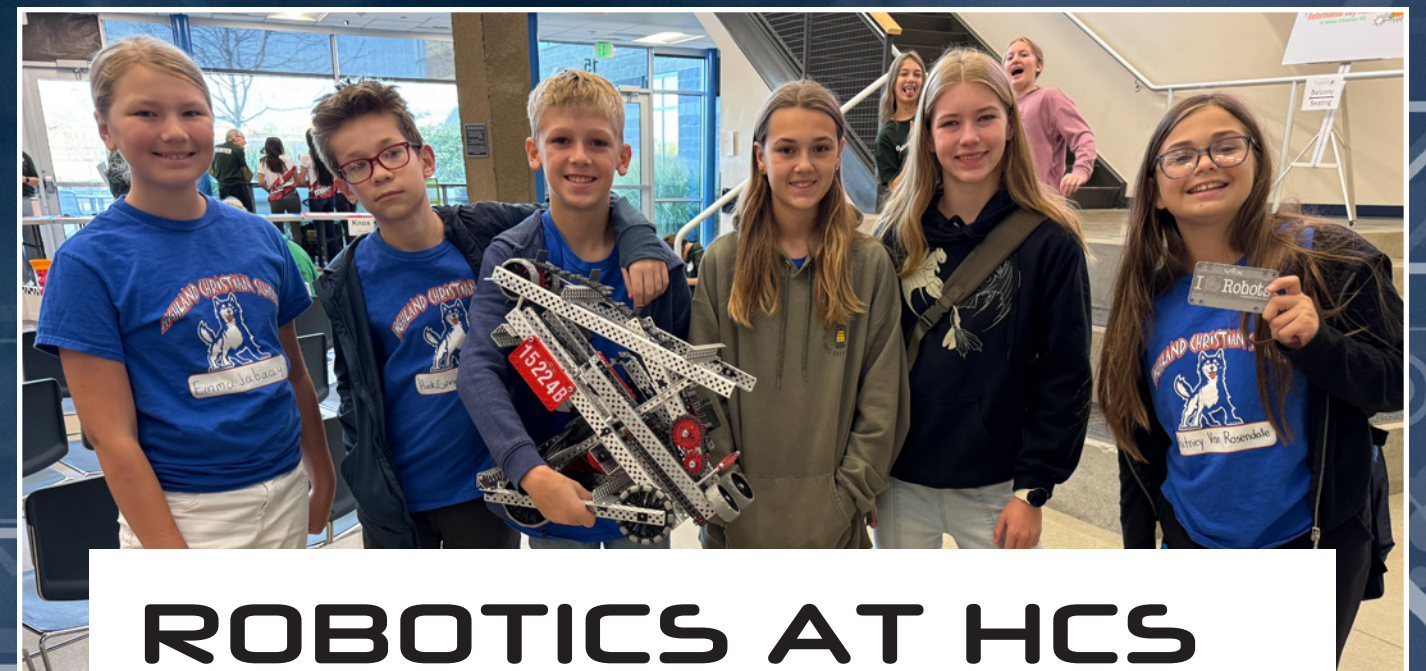
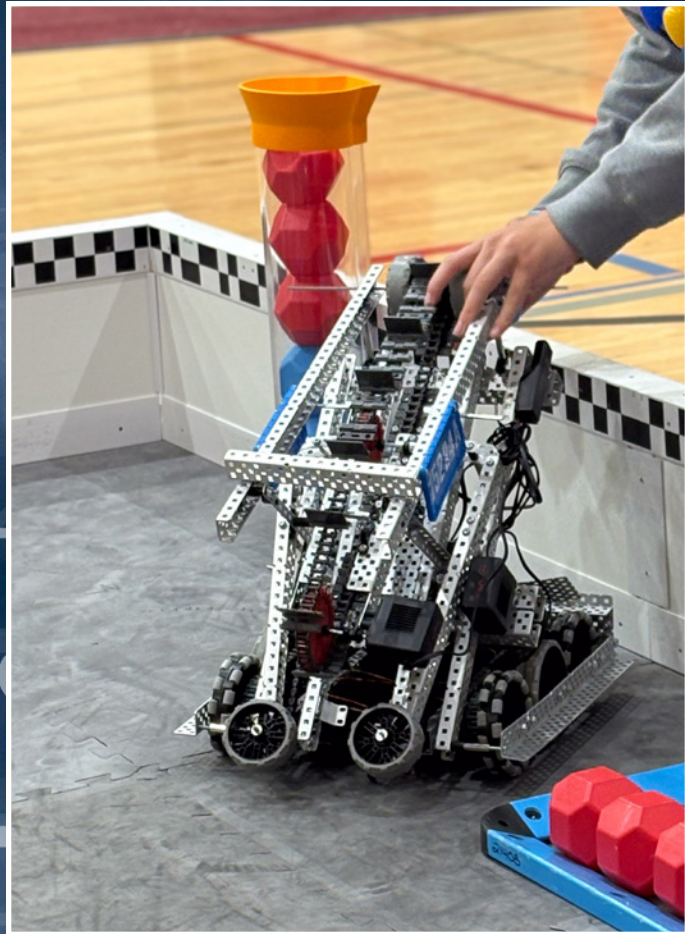

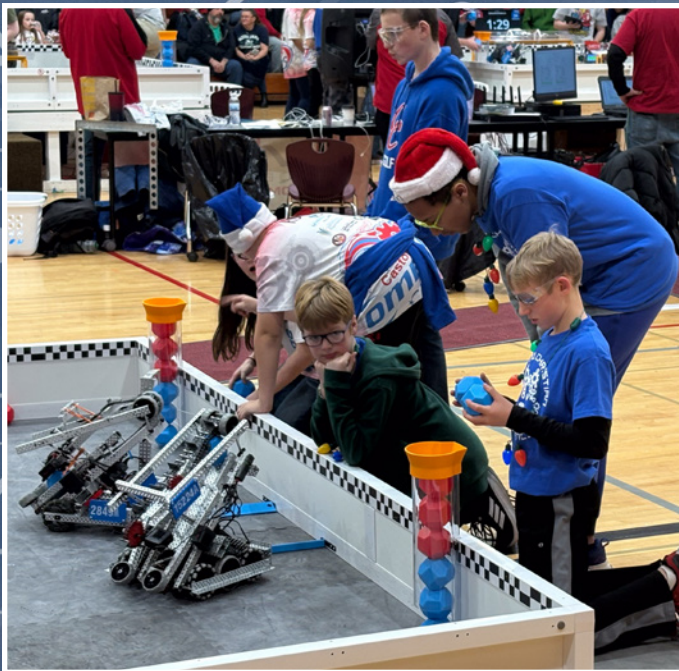

This year, our emphasis is on the role of Scripture Follower, as articulated in II Timothy 3:16-17: *All Scripture is God-breathed and is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness, so that the servant of God may be thoroughly equipped for every good work.* All-school chapels are designed to ground students in God's Word and cultivate their growth as Scripture Followers.

In September, pastors joined us to explore the significance of Scripture as God-breathed and its practical applications for training and correction. They also imparted valuable insights on how to lead a life rooted in righteousness. On Reformation Day, students again gathered to honor the significance of Scripture in the lives of the church reformers. Martin Luther recognized Scripture as God's Word that directs us to Christ. Through this chapel, we reaffirmed that our beliefs and actions should be guided by Scripture.

During our Christmas chapel, the narrative of Jesus' birth was vividly portrayed as students reenacted the scenes as the words

of Scripture were read aloud. This event served as a reminder of God's promise in the Old Testament for a Savior who was born in Bethlehem, announced by angels, visited by shepherds and worshiped by Magi. Reflecting on that story, we were reminded that while we wait for Jesus' return we **must make way for this King** in our hearts and lives.

Fifth grade students emphasized the importance of embodying Scripture by being Creation Caretakers. Additionally, the fourth graders reminded us through the miracle stories of Jesus that we must listen to His words and follow what He teaches.

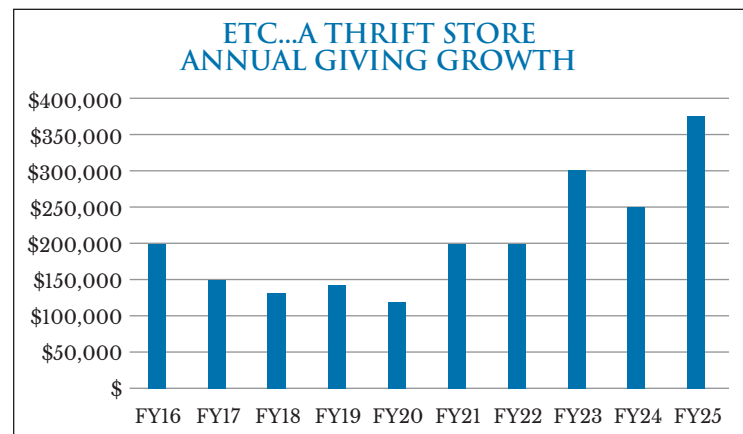

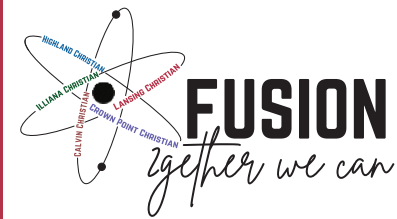

# JOINT BOARD COMMISSION UPDATE

On February 5 and 6, twenty representatives from the HCS community were invited to a two-day conversation around the future of Christian education. Led by Chad Dirkse from CACE (Center for the Advancement of Christian Education - out of Dordt University), this group of volunteers learned about the landscape of Christian education across the country, evaluated core features of HCS, and abstractly looked at how a merger would impact the students, faculty, community, and the mission of Highland Christian.

As a non-decision making group, these two days were filled with reflective thought and a new awareness of the challenges that Christian schools face. Some of these national and local realities include:

1. A staggering loss of biblical literacy in students and families. Across the country, biblical literacy has not just declined, but has fallen off the cliff.
2. The vacuum in locating, identifying and retaining highly qualified, Biblically grounded teachers. Currently, there are 400,000 open public school teaching positions nationwide.
3. A 36% nationwide increase in enrollment in Christian education since 2019. This surplus in demand has required schools to quickly adapt through growth, program advancements, and strategic adjustments.
4. An explosion of diagnosed disabilities and the layers of complexities it creates for our teachers, classrooms, and required services.
5. Increased pressure from association members on boards, school leaders, and teachers to deliver greater results, while expecting the cost for these results to remain relatively unchanged.
6. Donor engagement and fundraising dynamics have strained traditional development models.

As a next step, the three merger feasibility groups from Crown Point Christian, Highland Christian, and Illiana Christian will be meeting to discuss the collective findings and determine if exploring further conversations is a productive way to move forward. While a non-decision making group, Highland Christian's twenty participants voted 20-0 in favor of continuing in this conversation, as a recommendation to the HCS School Board.

I hadn't thought much about how the church dynamic affects the school, and this study challenged me to see how it would be irresponsible of HCS (and all the schools) to ignore how things are changing around us.

The bigger problem lies in the fact that there are multiple problems to be solved. Problems that if left unchecked will create even bigger divides and problems (in the future).

There has been a lot of change in the past few years, but I believe this study group was all on the same page that this is God's school and our focus is on His covenant children.

I found the event to be transformational and highly educational. After attending the two days, my opinion changed from a hard "no" to being on the 40 yard line.

I was surprised to learn how the school is challenged by the same changes in the world that the churches are. 1 Corinthians 14:33 says "For God is not a God of disorder but of peace." A local pastor once told me that doing our best to create order that reflects God's character in the world is worship.

In future discussions with the schools regarding mergers, we need to be leading from the front and not making decisions out of fear that we'll be left behind if the other schools decide to merge.

# FEATURED ALUMNI: ATIKILT BOSMAN

Recently, I had the opportunity to speak with Atikilt Bosman about her time in Christian education and the role and impact it has played in her life. Atikilt attended Highland Christian School preschool to 8th grade, and graduated in 2021. She then attended Illiana Christian High School and graduated in 2025. She is currently a freshman at Calvin University.

During our conversation, Atikilt reflected on what she believed was a key piece in her success at HCS: communication. She noted that whether you are struggling, need more time, or have questions, students are encouraged to go talk with their teachers. "Don't be scared of your teachers," she said, "They want you to succeed."

I asked Atikilt about subjects that stretched her while at HCS. She immediately said Mrs. Groen's history class. Mrs. Groen's depth of knowledge and her enjoyment of teaching the material are what contributed to it being such an engaging subject. Also, to Atikilt's recollection, it was the most rigorous class for her in Jr. High. Additionally, Atikilt spoke about spiritual growth while in Mrs. Huizenga's class. This class taught her that religion is individual and personal, and to make her faith her own. She thoroughly enjoyed the conversations that took place in class and participating in Chapels.

As our conversation continued, Atikilt shared that drama was a major experience at HCS that prepared her for Illiana. As a Jr. High student, she learned the appropriate terminology, was part of a creative team, and saw how drama allowed each person's role to shine. At Illiana, being plugged into drama also allowed her to grow and prioritize community, and to learn conflict and resolution.

Now, Atikilt is majoring in Social Work at Calvin University, where she will graduate with a Masters degree in five years. While she was drawn to Social Work intrinsically, she shared that HCS and Illiana's intentionality with inclusivity also played a big part in her area of study. During her time at HCS she was repeatedly asked to befriend new students and show them the ropes. This continued on at Illiana, as she became part of the Mentorship Program when the staff saw leadership qualities in her.

Atikilt would like to thank Mrs. Huizenga, Mrs. Groen, and the drama department for their formative role in her academics, spiritual, and extracurricular life. She is constantly sharing her experiences with her fellow Calvin co-horts, and the memories bring a smile to her face.
